



LLCs and PLLCs 2018 Annual Statements Due On or Before March 1

The Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) Corporations, Securities & Commercial Licensing Bureau (CSCL) today announced that 2018 annual statements and reports for limited liability companies (LLC) and professional limited liability companies (PLLC) are required to be filed on or before March 1.

Limited liability companies and professional limited liability companies are required to file an annual statement and report by February 15 of each year; however, due to increased demand for pre-assigned Customer ID Number (CID) and PIN information, an automatic 14-day extension will be granted.

[Section 909](#) of the Michigan Limited Liability Company Act (LLCA), Public Act 23 of 1993, provides that if a domestic or foreign PLLC fails to file a report or pay a fee required by this act within the time specified, the PLLC, in addition to its liability for the fee, is subject to a penalty of \$50.00. Penalties will be assessed for 2018 annual reports received after March 1, 2018.

Annual statements and reports can be submitted online at www.michigan.gov/corpfileonline. The first step to submit annual statements and reports online is to login to the system with the entity's CID and PIN. If you have forgotten the CID or PIN, please contact the Corporations Division at LARA-CSCL-CorpPIN@michigan.gov or call (517) 241-6470 to obtain that information. Please do **not** send multiple email requests for CID/PIN numbers, as this will slow processing time.

[Section 207a](#) of the LLCA provides that all domestic limited liability companies and foreign limited liability companies authorized to transact business in Michigan are required to file an annual statement each year. In addition, [Section 909](#) of the Act requires professional limited liability companies to file an annual report listing all of the members of the PLLC.

These sections also provide that if a limited liability company fails to file its annual statement/report or the filing fee is not paid for **two years**, the limited liability company will not be in good standing. The status of the limited liability company will be "active, but not in good standing."

A limited liability company that is not in good standing is not entitled to a certificate of good standing; its company name will be available for use by another entity, and no document will be filed on behalf of the company other than a certificate of restoration.
